- Concerning educational attainment, **19.2% of Berkshire County, MA residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (1.1% below the national average), and **10.2% hold an Associate's Degree** (1.5% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2021 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and General Medical and Surgical Hospitals.









Unemployment by Gender





Unemployment by Ethnicity










Unemployment Rate Trends

Berkshire County, MA had a November 2021 unemployment rate of 5.69%, increasing from 4.67% 5 years before.





millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 25,671.






Veterans

Berkshire County, MA has 8,354 veterans. The national average for an area this size is 6.953.




Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is high in Berkshire County, MA. The national average for an area this size is 37,076 people 55 or older, while there are 50,997 here.




Violent Crime

Racial diversity is low in Berkshire County, MA. The national average for an area this size is 50,175 racially diverse people, while there are 15,718 here.




Property Crime










Top Growing Industries






Top Industry Location Quotient






Top Industry GRP



Top Occupation Location Quotient











Top Posted Occupations

Unique Average Monthly Postings




